



Continuing: Many charges were brought against Christ, but either the witnesses disagreed, or the evidence was of such a nature that it would not be accepted by the Romans.

They tried to make Him speak in answer to their accusations, but He appeared as if He had not heard them.

The silence of Christ at this time <u>had been thus described by the prophet Isaiah</u>: {SJ 115.3}

"He was oppressed, and He was afflicted, yet He opened not His mouth:

He is brought as a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before her shearers is dumb,

so He openeth not His mouth." Isaiah 53:7. {SJ 115.4}

The priests began to fear that they would fail of obtaining any evidence which they could bring against their prisoner before Pilate. They felt that one last effort must be made.





Continuing: "I adjure Thee by the living God,
that Thou tell us whether Thou be the Christ, the son of God." Matthew 26:63. {SJ 116.1}
The Saviour never denied His mission or His relation to the Father.
He could remain silent to personal insult, but He ever spoke plainly and decidedly when His work or Sonship to God was called in question. {SJ 116.2}
Every ear was bent to listen, and every eye was fixed upon Him as He answered:
"Thou hast said." {SJ 116.3}

In the custom of those days this was the same as answering, "Yes," or, "It is as thou hast said." This was the strongest form of an affirmative answer.


A heavenly light seemed to illuminate the pale countenance of the Saviour as He added: 116.4}







#### Cathartes aura

When one thinks about the bird-life along the coast, they may not immediately consider this large scavenger. But as with any ecosystem, scavengers are an important element to nature's eternal cycle of renewal. The turkey vulture's diet consists only of carrion, so they can

be commonly found at the edge of roads feeding on road-kill or picking away at dead marine animals washed up on local beaches. Their large wingspan allows them to float on thermal updrafts without expending much energy. Even at great heights, their superior sense of smell can detect ethyl mercaptan — a gas produced by rotting bodies. Once found, the birds will congregate in the area by large numbers. Their Latin name means "purifier."

Intelligent and curious birds, vultures live and roost in large groups although they will generally forage alone. In terms of reproduction, females will generally lay no more than two eggs which she and the male will take turns caring for. The chicks break out of the eggs in about thirty to forty days and are cared for by their parents for the next eleven weeks. The parents and young will flock together throughout the following fall, then part company permanently.

### **Range and Habitat**

Ranges widely throughout Oregon, across North America as far north as Canada and south to the tip of South America. Roosts are commonly in trees, cliffs, burrows, caves or on tall buildings.

"Cherry blossom trees, or flowering cherry trees, belong to the genus Prunus, which includes not only cherries but also plums, almonds, peaches, and apricots. The genus is part of the Rosaceae family. Many species and cultivars of flowering cherry are used for their blossoms, with Prunus serrulata (Japanese Cherry) being one of the most popular for ornamental use."

"Oxalis regnellis or shamrock plant refers to a smaller specimen, which does not often reach over 6 inches. Delicate flowers blossom on and off during spring, winter, and fall.

Its clover-shaped leaves come in a variety of shades. Some people think that these plants bring good luck. The leaves of this plant fold up during the night and then, open up when the light comes back."

"When you grow oxalis houseplants, their dormant period lasts from some weeks to even three months. Usually, it depends on the growing conditions and cultivar. Once the dormancy breaks, new shoots come up. During that time, you need to move your shamrock houseplants to areas that receive bright light or near a sunny window. Resume to care for the plants to get rewarded with some attractive blooms and foliage."

#### **Bird Shaped Flower In The Wild**

The hummingbird lookalike was first described in the early 1800s. A botanical scientist named Adam Cunningham noticed the unusual plant and recorded its use.

The bird-shaped flower's natural habitat is Norther Australia, although you can find it in Central and West Australia too. This plant loves dry and semi-dry areas. There's been a long debate whether the plant's flowers intentionally evolved to look like birds. This could have been essential to their pollination and survival. Camouflage is nature's number one way to cope with predators. Additionally, the characteristic look raises the flower's value and makes them ideal for trading. Scientists agree that even though the human eyes perceive the flowers as birds' lookalikes, animals don't see them this way. Our brain has a diverse judgment process. As a result, we tend to find resemblances in new shapes.

Plant That Looks Like Hummingbirds – What Is That? beautiful Australian shrubs shape like a hummingbird

Nature never ceases to amaze us, from fascinating species and colors to a plant that looks like hummingbirds — on a continent that has no hummingbirds!

Due to its unusual flowers, the green bird flower drew the public's attention merely a few years ago. What's even more surprising is the native country of this charming plant. Australia doesn't have hummingbirds yet has a unique plant that looks like a bunch of hummers on a stem!

The plant in question is known as the green flowerbird or regal flowerbird. Crotalaria cunninghamii is the stunning plant's scientific name. It's a member of the legume family that includes chickpeas and alfalfa. The perennial shrub is native to inland northern Australia, where it thrives along sandy dunes. Its ties to Australia are quite ironic, considering that no hummingbirds live there.

### Sapphire Tower Super Teal Plant Tree is a Bromeliad



The flowers are variously described as sapphire blue, <u>teal</u>, and tourquise blue-green in color and have bright orange anthers. Bees and <u>hummingbirds</u> are attracted to the flowers by the abundant amount of nectar they produce and <u>the birds sit on the sterile branches</u> between the flowers to feed. The color of the long lasting flowers is very unique in the plant kingdom and makes sapphire tower a focal point the garden.

The bee hummingbird, when fully grown, measures about two inches (5 centimeters) and weighs about 1/10 ounce (3 grams). Their nest is the size of half a walnut shell. As the bee hummingbird is very small, so God wants His people to be small in self-serving and large in giving.

The large ostrich is too big to fly while the tiny hummingbird is unsurpassed in the way they can move around, flying forward, backward, upside down, up and down and from side to side.

### Hummingbirds

We have learned that the hummingbird is the smallest bird, builds the smallest nest, and lays the smallest eggs. The ruby-throated hummingbird's nest is built high in the branches of the trees. She builds her nest of shreds of bark, soft grass, and bits of plant or cattail fluff. She sometimes covers the outside with lichen or bits of bark. This helps camouflage her nest. God kept Elijah camouflaged so Ahab and Jezebel could not find him. The female lays two tiny eggs about the size of navy beans. The young hatch in about two weeks. The babies have no feathers when hatched, and cannot see. In about three weeks they have their feathers and are strong enough to leave the nest.

### "On Bended Knee

those who have a spirit of intelligence in the things of God. {2SM 314.2}




**Continuing:**


Israel knew not the Son of God.




Yet the priests and rulers were not at rest. They had carried out their purpose in putting Christ to death; but they did not feel the sense of victory they had expected. Even in the hour of their apparent triumph, they were harassed with doubts as to what would next take place. {Next Slide Please}



**Continuing:** They had heard the cry, "It is finished." "Father, into Thy hands I commend My spirit." John 19:30; Luke 23:46. They had seen the rocks rent, and had felt the mighty earthquake, and they were restless and uneasy. **{DA 771.1}** 



They had been jealous of Christ's influence with the people when living; they were jealous of Him even in death. They dreaded the dead Christ more, far more, than they had ever feared the living Christ. They dreaded to have the attention of the people directed any further to the events attending His crucifixion. They feared the results of that day's work. {Next Slide Please}



### **Continuing:**

Not on any account would they have had His body remain on the cross during the Sabbath.


The Sabbath was now drawing on, and it would be a violation of its sanctity for the bodies to hang upon the cross.

So, using this as a pretext, the leading Jews requested Pilate that the death of the victims might be hastened, and their bodies be removed before the setting of the sun.



Pilate was as unwilling as they for the body of Jesus to remain upon the cross. His consent having been obtained, the legs of the two thieves were broken to hasten their death; but Jesus was found to be already dead. The rude soldiers had been softened by what they had heard and seen of Christ and they were restrained from breaking His limbs. Thus in the offering of the Lamb of God was fulfilled the law of the Passover, "They shall leave none of it unto the morning, nor break any bone of it: according to all the ordinances of the Passover they shall keep it." Numbers 9:12 {DA 771.3}




The priests and rulers were amazed to find that Christ was dead. **Death by the cross** was a lingering process; it was difficult to determine when life had ceased. It was an unheard-of thing for one to die within six hours of crucifixion. The priests wished to make sure of the death of Jesus, and at their suggestion a soldier thrust a spear into the Saviour's side. {Next Slide Please}



**Continuing:** 

From the wound thus made, there flowed two copious and distinct streams, one of blood, the other of water. This was noted by all the beholders, and John states the occurrence very definitely. He says, "One of the soldiers with a spear pierced His side, and forthwith came there out blood and water.
