A satanic fury then took possession of the leaders and the people.

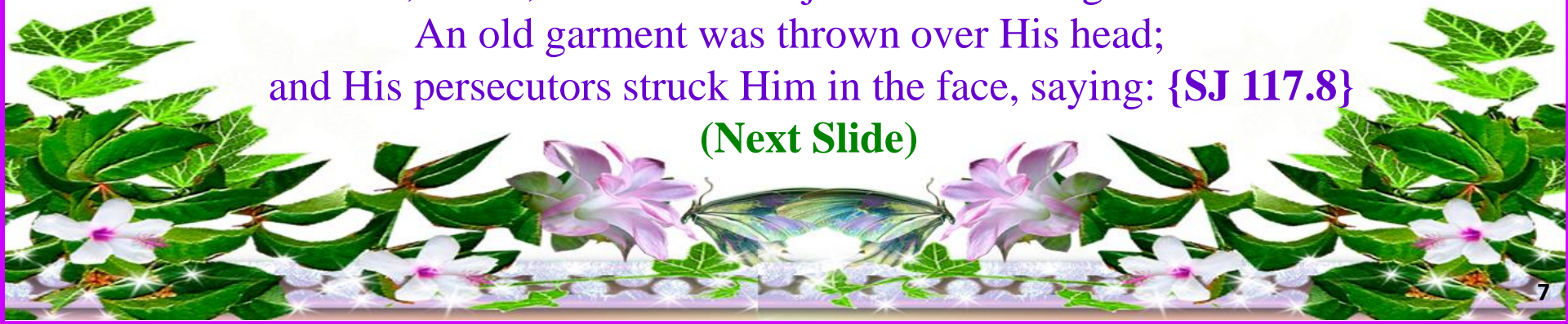
The roar of voices was like that of wild beasts.

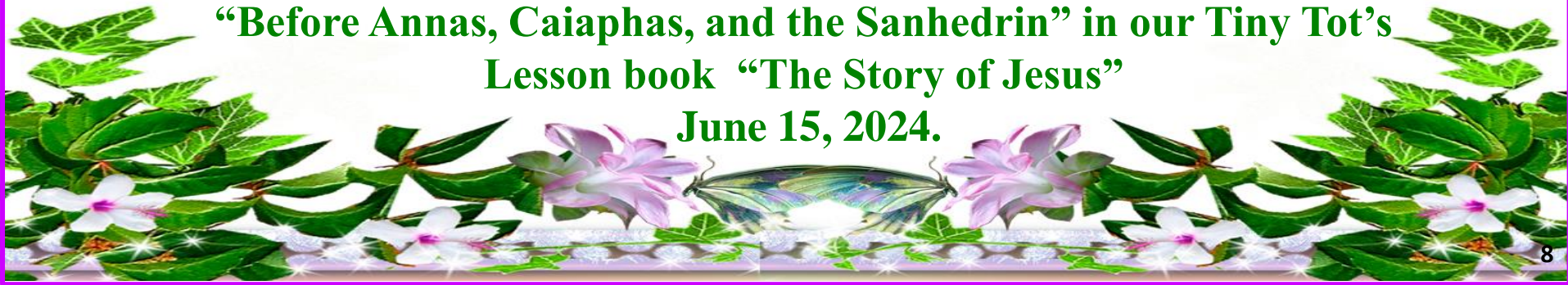

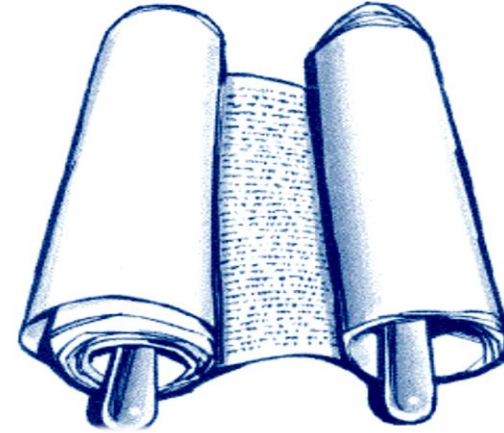

A Mammal's Body Systems II

3. Nervous System

What is the Nervous System of a mammal? It is the system that regulates most body activities. The Nervous System is made up of the brain, spinal cord, and the nerves associated with it. Mammals have larger brains than other animals.

The brain of a mammal has a well-developed cerebral cortex (learning center of the brain). But man is more intelligent than the mammal. He can choose to **revere** and worship God, like the publican did. It is through the brain nerves that God communicates with man.

4. Respiratory System

What is the work of the Respiratory System in a mammal? It enables them to breathe. The Respiratory System has two lungs and various tubes leading to the nostrils. The diaphragm (a muscular sheet) divides the chest cavity from the abdominal cavity and aids in breathing. Mammals are the only animals that have a muscular diaphragm. Usually the nostrils are at the end of the snout or nose. Dolphins (one nostril) and whales (two nostrils) have blowholes at the top of the head. The Respiratory System reminds us that prayer is the breath of the soul.

Other Systems

Mammals also have other body systems that help them live and move.

Even mammals are:

"...Wonderfully made: marvelous are thy works; and that my soul knoweth right well" (Psalm 139:14).

Man is also wonderfully made. He was created to humbly and reverently worship God.

Remind

1. As you work together as a family, let your chores remind you of your lesson.
2. Notice how you think and breathe while you do your chores. It reminds us of the special brain God gave to man that he might choose to worship Him. Notice how you are constantly breathing. It can remind you to "*pray without ceasing*" (I Thessalonians 5:17). "Unceasing prayer is the unbroken union of the soul with God, so that life from God flows into our life; and from our life, purity and holiness flow back to God." (*Steps to Christ* 98)

Remarkable Parent Food

"During these last months of His ministry, many of Christ's parables were spoken. The priests and rabbis pursued Him with ever-increasing bitterness, and His warnings to them He veiled in symbols. They could not mistake His meaning, yet they could find in His words nothing on which to ground an accusation against Him. In the parable of the Pharisee and the publican, the self-sufficient prayer, 'God, I thank thee, that I am not as other men,' stood out in sharp contrast to the penitent's plea, 'God be merciful to me a sinner.' (Luke 18:11, 13, KJV). Thus Christ rebuked the hypocrisy of the Jews.

And under the figures of the barren fig tree and the great supper He foretold the doom about to fall upon the impenitent nation. Those who had scornfully rejected the invitation to the gospel feast heard His warning words: '*I say unto you, that none of those men which were bidden shall taste of My supper*' (Luke 14:24)." (*The Desire of Ages* 495)

Continuing:

Neither Joseph nor Nicodemus had openly accepted the Saviour while He was living. They knew that such a step would exclude them from the Sanhedrin, and they hoped to protect Him by their influence in its councils. For a time they had seemed to succeed; but the wily priests, seeing their favor to Christ, had thwarted their plans.

In their absence Jesus had been condemned and delivered to be crucified. Now that He was dead, they no longer concealed their attachment to Him. {Next Slide Please}

needed at this time.


They could do for their dead

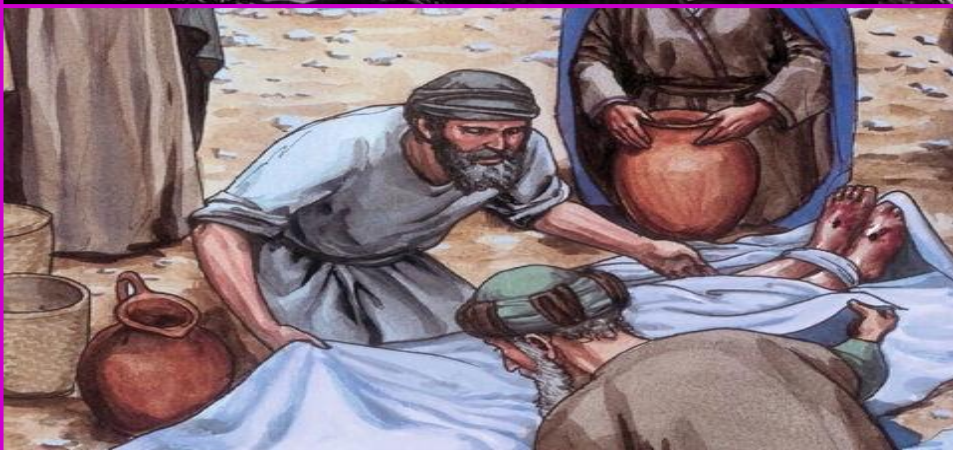
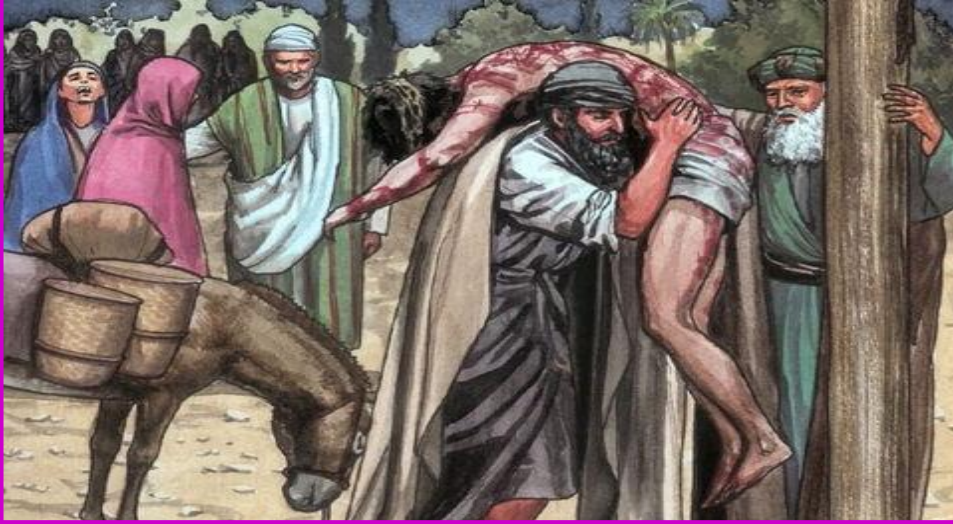

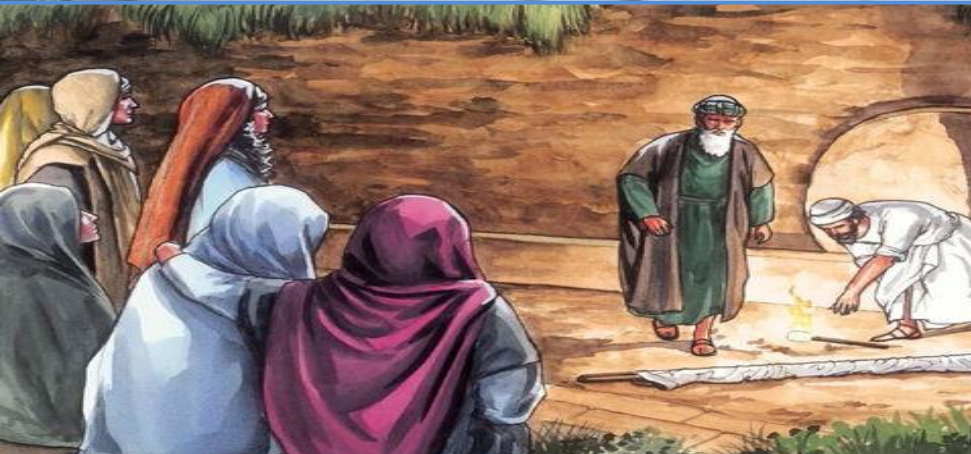
Gently and reverently they removed with their own hands the body of Jesus from the cross.

Joseph owned a new tomb, hewn in a rock. This he was reserving for himself; but it was near Calvary, and he now prepared it for Jesus.

The body, together with the spices brought by Nicodemus, was carefully wrapped in a linen sheet, {Next Slide Please}





Continuing: and the Redeemer was borne to the tomb. There the three disciples straightened the mangled limbs, and folded the bruised hands upon the pulseless breast. The Galilean women came to see that all had been done that could be done for the lifeless form of their beloved Teacher. Then they saw the heavy stone rolled against the entrance of the tomb, and the Saviour was left at rest. {Next Slide Please}

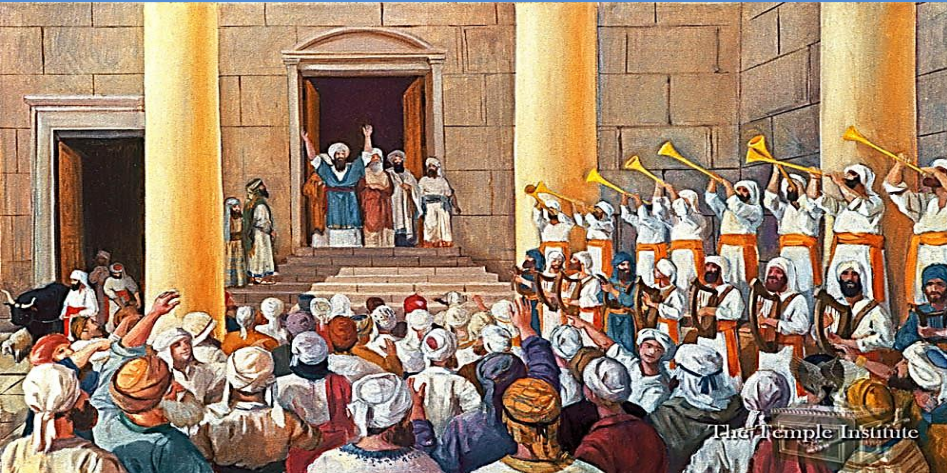

The high priest from Golgotha was there, splendidly robed in his sacerdotal garments.

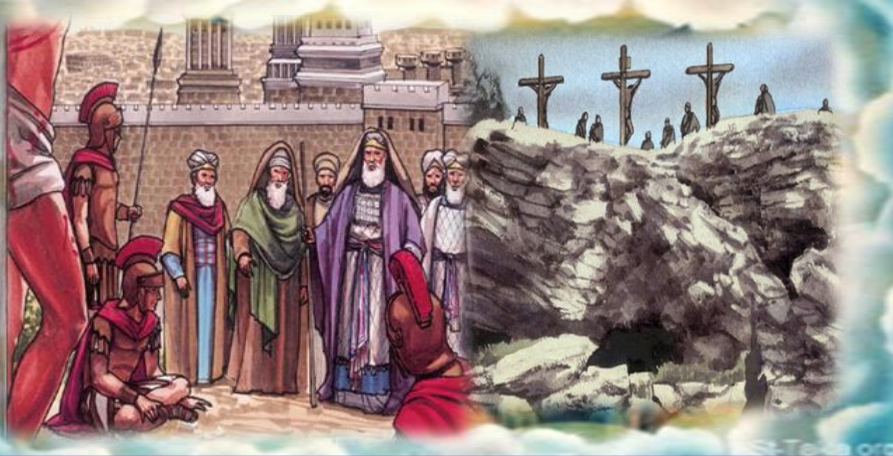
White-turbaned priests, full of activity, performed their duties.

The trumpets and musical instruments and the voices of the singers were as loud and clear as usual.

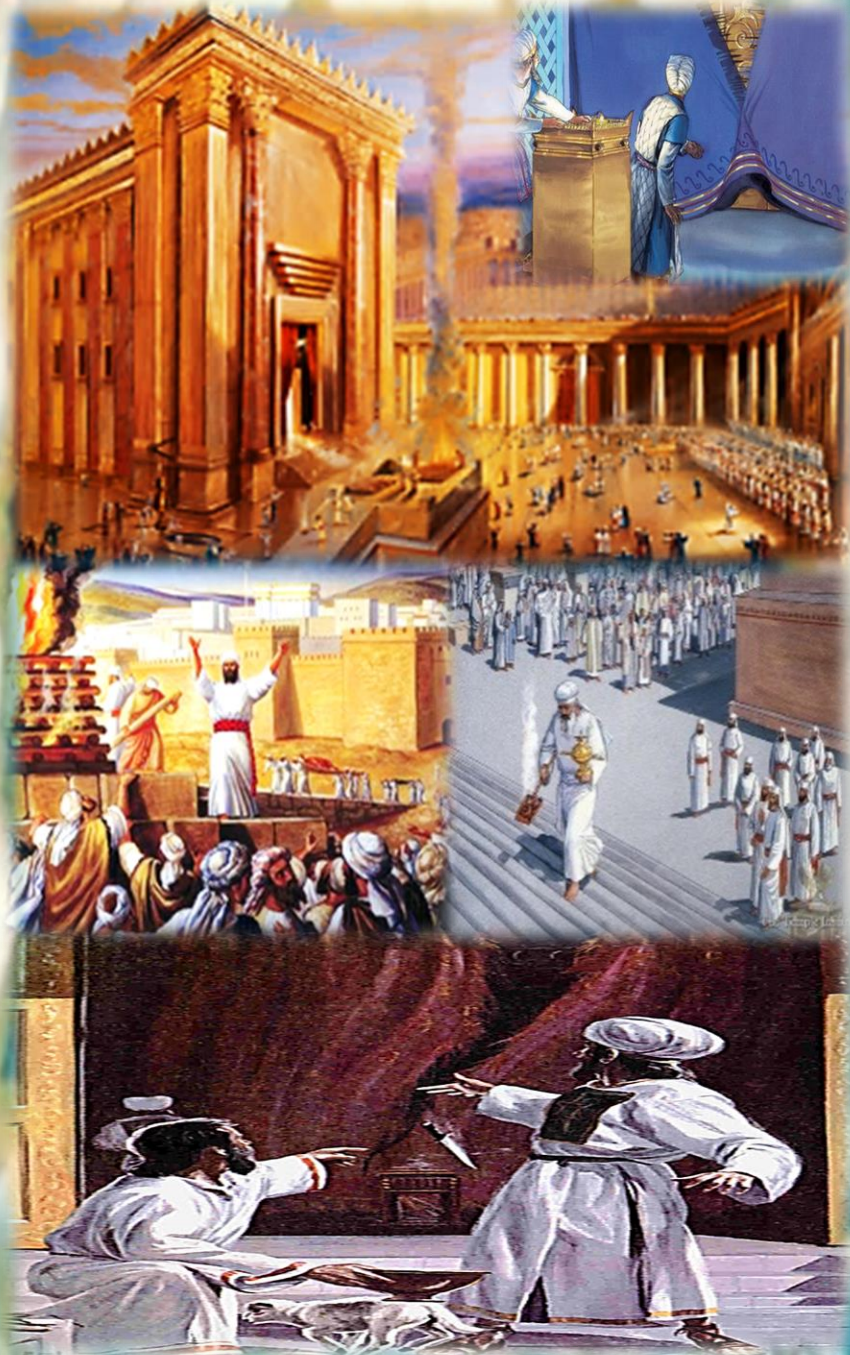
But a sense of strangeness pervaded everything.
