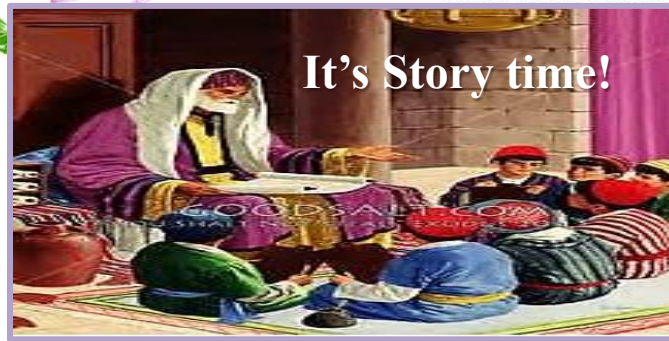

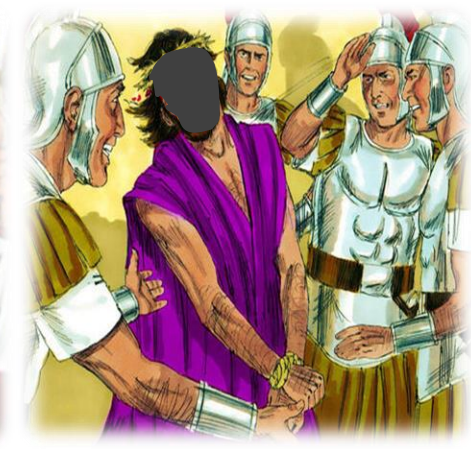
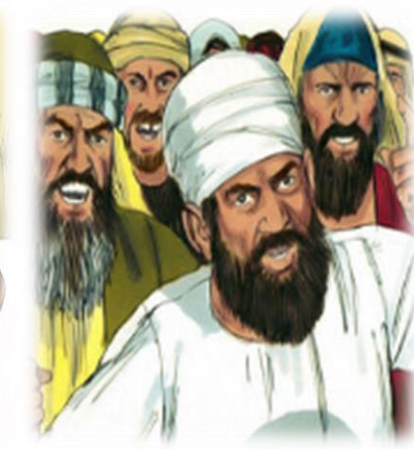

Chapter 21 – “Before Herod”

Herod had never met Jesus, but he had long desired to see Him,
and to witness His marvelous power.

As the Saviour was brought before him, the rabble surged and pressed about,
some crying one thing, and some another.

Herod commanded silence, for he wished to question the prisoner. **{SJ 129.1}**

He looked with curiosity and pity upon the pale face of Christ.

He saw there the marks of deep wisdom and purity. He was satisfied, as Pilate had been,
that malice and envy alone had caused the Jews to accuse the Saviour. **{SJ 129.2}**

Herod urged Christ to perform one of His wonderful miracles before him.

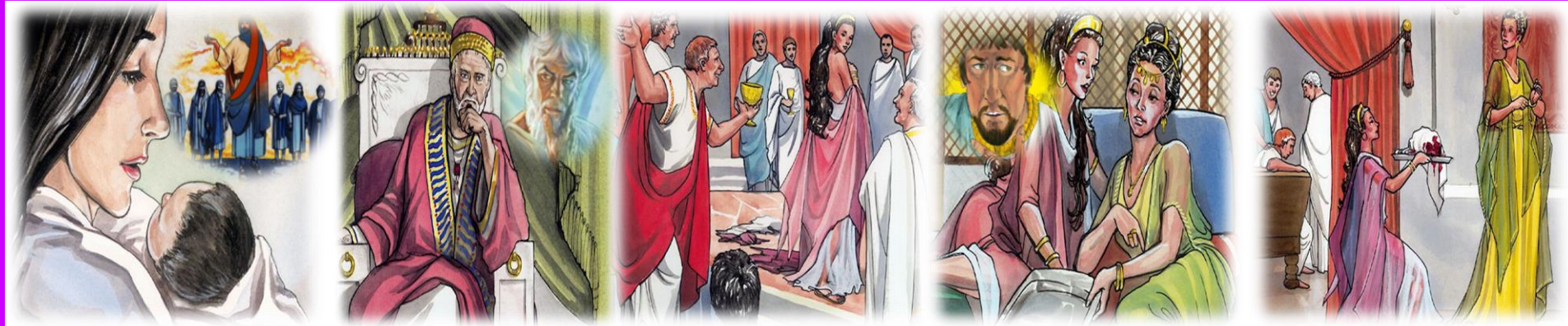
He promised to release Him if He would do so. By his direction, crippled and
deformed persons were brought in, and he commanded Jesus to heal them.

But the Saviour stood before Herod as one who neither saw nor heard.

{SJ 129.3}

Continuing: The Son of God had taken upon Himself man's nature.

He must do as man must do in similar circumstances.

Therefore He would not work a miracle to gratify curiosity, or to save Himself from the pain and humiliation that man must endure when placed in a similar position. {SJ 129.4}

His accusers were terrified when Herod demanded of Christ a miracle.

Of all things they dreaded most an exhibition of His divine power.

Such a manifestation would be a death blow to their plans, and would perhaps cost them their lives. So they set up the cry that Jesus worked miracles through the power given Him by Beelzebub, the prince of the devils. {SJ 130.1}

Several years before this, Herod had listened to the teaching of John the Baptist.

He had been deeply impressed, but he had not forsaken his life of intemperance and sin.

So his heart grew harder, and at last in a drunken revel he had commanded that John should be slain to please the wicked Herodias. {SJ 130.2}

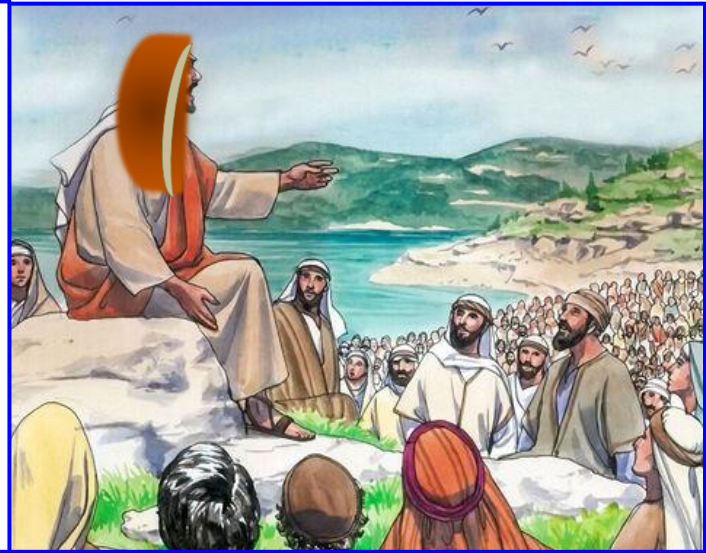

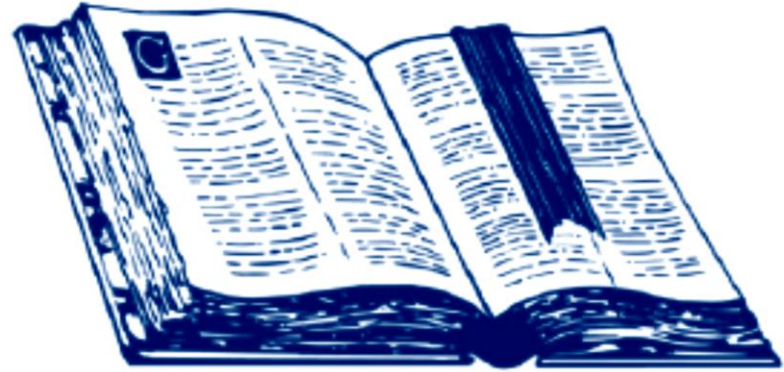

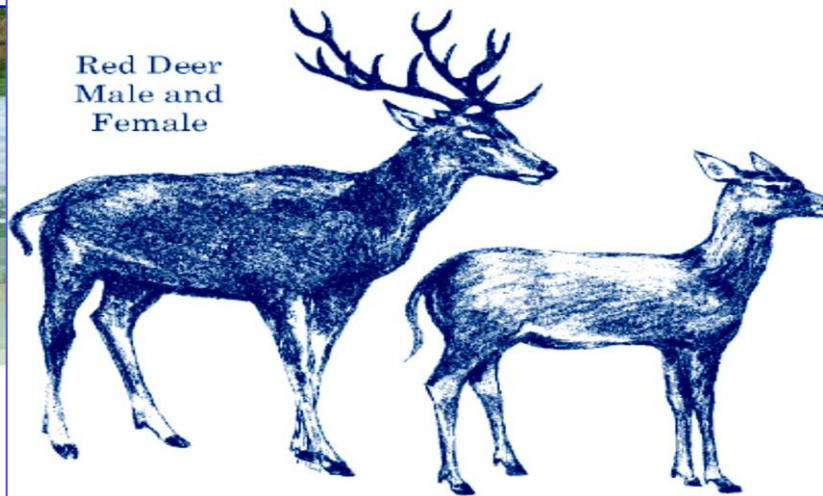


Deer of Bible Lands

There were three kinds of deer in the Bible lands. They were the red deer, the fallow deer, and the roe deer. Deer are hunted and killed and used for food by man. God never intended His creatures to be used in this way. He would rather man be “*merciful*” to the animals. Many years ago, people on the American Frontier used deer hides, known as buckskins, as a type of money. This is why you sometimes hear people call a dollar bill a “buck.”

The red deer was a forest mammal and was protected as royal game. An adult stands about 4 to 5 feet (1.2 - 1.5 meters) at the shoulders. It had spreading antlers with ten or more points which were shed each year, but they grow again the next year. Those people who have **self-control** are truly royal. Like the deer losing its antlers, the righteous may meet with earthly loss for a while, but a time of the restoration of all things will come to them if they meekly wait. As the deer regrow their majestic antlers, so “*He will beautify the meek with salvation*” (Psalm 149:4).


A fallow deer was much smaller than the red deer, standing only about 3 feet (2.7 meters). Its colors range from normal red-brown to light brown to almost black. The antlers are flattened toward the ends with short points. They like living in the hill forests. All deer are usually spotted at birth, but fallow deer remained spotted at all ages. These spots are more noticeable in the summer. Spots in the Scriptures represent sin. (See Jude 23.) God wants a people of whom He can say, "*Thou art all fair, my love; there is no spot in thee*" (Song of Solomon 4:7). "*That he might present it*

to himself a glorious church, not having spot...or any such thing; but that it might be holy and without blemish” (Ephesians 5:27). The fallow deer keep their spots throughout their lives. They can remind us of how some people do not overcome their sins. The other kinds of deer that out-grow their spots can represent sanctification. The word “fallow” is thought to come from a root word that means “to fail.” The fallow deer can remind us of those who “*fail of the grace of God*” (Hebrews 12:15). These do not “*hunger and thirst after righteousness*” (Matthew 5:6).

The roe deer was the smallest of the deer. It only stood about 28 inches (71.12 centimeters) and had short upright antlers different from all other deer. The doe (female deer) was heavier than the buck (male deer), and weighed up to 60 pounds (27 kilograms). In our character we need to be small (humble, meek) like the roe deer. The roe deer lived alone, staying mostly undercover, and came out of the woods only to graze in the fields.

Because of its secret habits it lived almost unknown in many woodlands. When **self-control** is practiced self becomes unknown in the life.





In Psalm 42:1 it says, *“As the hart panteth after the water brooks, so panteth my soul after thee, O God.”* The word *“pant”* can mean to *“bray”* or *“yearn for.”* Often, if there is a shortage of water, a stag (hart or male deer) can be heard braying loudly for water. One stag who was in captivity accidentally was not given water for eight days. He began to call and did not stop until water was mercifully given. It would be well if we would *“pant”* after the *“Water of Life”* like the hart (stag or male deer). Two times that a deer can be extremely thirsty are: (1) when running from danger, and (2) when fighting. This can remind us how Christians can develop a thirst for God’s Word when they (1) *“flee”* from *“youthful lusts”* and (2) when they *“resist the devil”* in spiritual combat (war) (II Timothy 2:22; James 4:7).

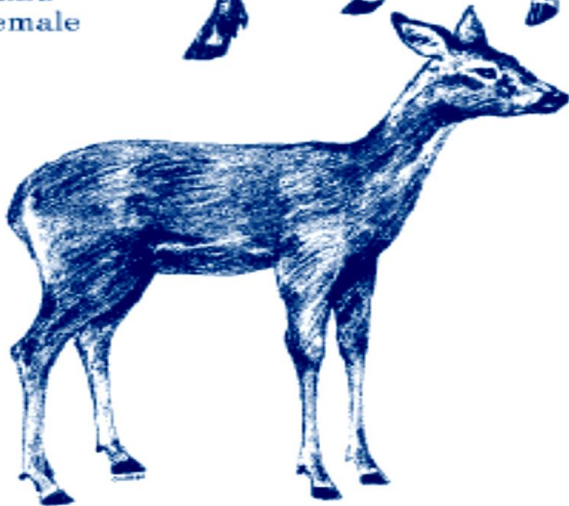

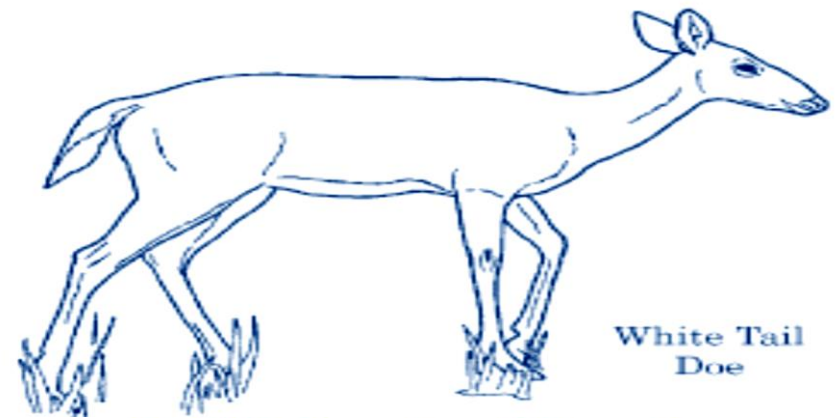
Reinforce

Continuing:


